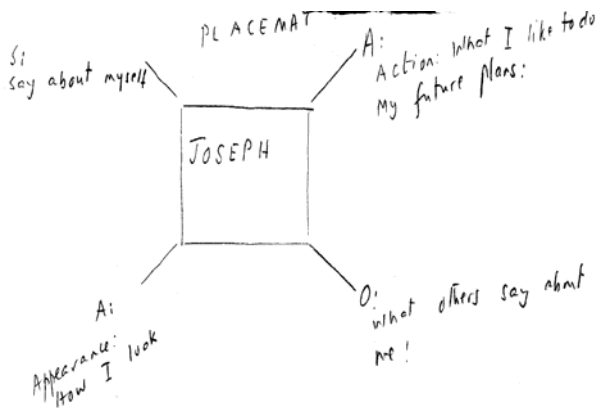

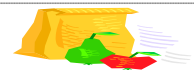

## Chaplain's Commentary

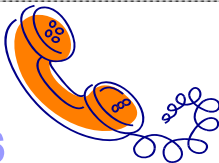

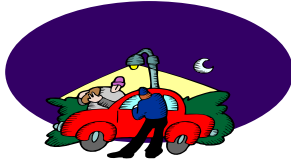

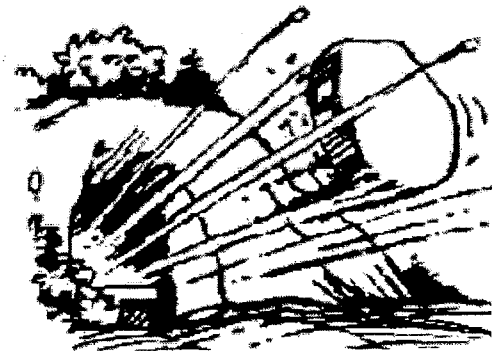
