FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

Dear Parents,

Last week the College staff attended the annual state CSA (Christian Schools Australia) conference held down in Bunbury. What an awesome time! Our Keynote speaker was Allan Meyer, renowned Christian minister, author and driving force behind Careforce Church and ministries. Allan became a teacher and taught for seven years before entering the ministry. His Careforce ministry has been wonderfully instrumental in helping people in many areas of emotional and spiritual need across Australia and Asia and beyond.

Allan focused on the role of the *Christian* teacher in a *Christian* School. We were reminded of our responsibility in Christ to not simply teach but to live out our Christian walk as a living testimony to the students entrusted to our care. He equated *teaching* with *discipleship*.

As *Christian* teachers we not only need to impart information and skills, we must also carry the extra responsibility of being Christ's representatives before our students. It is only by renewing our relationship with God on a constant basis that we are able to achieve this.

As Christian teachers one of the challenges we face is getting the right mix between Godly grace and responsible discipline. (Discipline...*disciple* – there's that word again.) Too often we fall into the trap of confusing *grace* with *consequence*. We know that God's grace is sufficient for all our transgressions - but we also know that God's Grace doesn't extend to interfering with the reality of the consequences of our actions. (If I break the speed limit God will still love me but that won't stop me from getting the fine I deserve...) When we extend grace without consequence a child will ultimately find him or herself in a place of insecurity because there is no *tangible* consequence for their actions. As Christian teachers we need a healthy dose of God's wisdom

when deciding on an *appropriate* consequence in each situation.

We have a vision to see every child at TCC using their God-given talents to achieve to their full potential in all areas of their lives. This requires that we teach our children to make good *choices*. For our children to make good choices they need an environment of clear parameters to guide them in their decision-making. Clear parameters provide our children with a measure of security when they are called on to make decisions. Ideally home and College should embrace similar parameters.

As we embark on our journey through the second semester of the year it is my prayer that College and family will work hand in hand to ensure the best possible environment for our children to grow, make healthy choices and achieve to their full potential.
